Notes from the pastor:

So the Lord said to Moses, "Gather for me seventy of the elders of Israel, whom you know to be the elders of the people and officers over them; bring them to the tent of meeting, and have them take their place there with you. I will come down and talk with you there; and I will take some of the spirit that is on you and put it on them; and they shall bear the burden of the people along with you so that you will not bear it all by yourself. *Numbers 11:16-17*

Moses is toast. He has been carrying the burdens of his tribe/congregation pretty much alone. Aaron has been some help, but Moses is just overwhelmed. He is so angry that he asks God to kill him now, rather than make him continue. (Numbers 11:14-15). God has a better idea. He summons the other leaders of the Israelites and gives them some of the spirit that is on Moses so they can assist. This is the earliest reference to elders in scripture. From the elders who work right a long side of Moses to the disciples of Jesus, no leader goes it alone. Nor should they.

I am meeting with your church officer Nominating Committee this week. They will take time in prayer and discernment to listen to God's leading as to who God has called to be the elders and deacons at Holy Way. It is important work. The elders and deacons of Holy Way will set the stage for the mission and ministry that God calls you to here in Tucson. They work with the pastor, but ultimately the vision comes through them. I have been very impressed with the leadership and look forward to continuing to walk alongside them. This can be a very exciting time for all of you. I ask for prayers for Jeannie, Bill, MaryAnn and Dearwyn as they undertake this work. Please prayerfully consider if God is calling you into the ministry of elder or deacon and let Jeannie know.

It has been a busy first month for me here at Holy Way. I feel very welcomed and supported in my work. I have met with most committees and am very impressed on what you all accomplish with a smaller group of folks. I have






Special Service this Sunday – All Saints Sunday Celebration.

Donating IRA Assets to Charity

Turn your required distributions into charitable donations.

IRS rules mandate that individuals age 70 1/2 and older take RMDs (Required Minimum Distributions) from their IRA each year, regardless of whether the income is needed. These annual withdrawals are subject to ordinary income taxes. By making a contribution from your IRA to the church or other charity, you can satisfy your RMD amount without reporting additional income.

This provision may be especially attractive for retirees who don't need all the income from their IRA to meet current living expenses. By donating the money to a charity, you can enjoy the satisfaction of knowing that you are contributing to a worthy cause while effectively lowering your tax bill.

How it works:

The provision allows retirees age 70 1/2 and older to donate up to \$100,000 tax

free from their IRA each year. Generally, when you take a distribution from your IRA, it is treated as taxable income. Under this provision, made permanent in the 2015 federal spending and tax package, those assets are excluded from income if the distribution is made directly to charity.

The distribution is not included in your income so you avoid the potential negative consequences that regular IRA withdrawals in retirement can create, including taxes on Social Security benefits. Normally, charitable contribution deductions are limited or are eliminated altogether for taxpayers who do not itemize deductions.

Talk to your financial representative

It's important to consider your tax situation before deciding whether to make a charitable contribution from your IRA. Be sure to work closely with your financial advisor to determine whether this tax provision is right for you.




October Report

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED



Diaper Bank

Fact: Over 25 million American adults suffer from incontinence.

In addition to diapers for babies, the Diaper Bank also provides incontinence and feminine hygiene products. The Holy Way focuses on adult products as there is a great need for adult products. The Holy Way is about the only organization in Tucson that provides adult products to the Diaper Bank of Southern Arizona. The Diaper Bank can make the dollar stretch much farther than any individual donation. For every one dollar donated, the Bank is able to purchase three dollars worth of product. If you wish to help continue this worthy cause, you can donate money (cash or check) or bring in adult incontinence products. Earmark your check or place cash in an envelope to: "Diaper Bank." Kathy can collect the funds. If you have adult products to donate, either bring them to the church or let Carol Portillo know-or contact Kathy in the office.

People who have Food Stamps cannot use them for feminine products.

Outreach/Mission

This Committee has several projects going that serve our immediate church family and surrounding areas. It is the hope of this committee that we can "reach out" to the community and hopefully bring in new members. Some of the projects are: the food pantry, adult products, Way of Warmth (blankets), Trunk or Treat, Thanksgiving meal boxes, and Craft Sales.



Tzedakah Box



Tzedakah is the Hebrew word that means charity, and at its heart it means righteous, fairness, and justice. These boxes are used to collect donations for a specific charity, and our box will be used to collect donations for upcoming community events.

Our Tzedakah box is in the Narthex on the table next to the office door. Currently, all donations received at this time are earmarked for *Thanksgiving meals* to needy families in our immediate area.

Scammers And Phishing

A scammer is one who deceives and defraud's someone. Unfortunately, there are many deceptive people who want your money! They are very convincing, and many very intelligent people have been scammed.

Never, never give out any personal information over the phone unless you know who you are talking to (i.e., your doctor's office).

Some scammers want to "give" you a prize or threaten you. Remember, federal agencies will not ask for your social security number or other personal information over the phone.

And, there are the scammers who want you to purchase gift cards or send them cash. Nope. Don't do it! No matter how convincing they are. They are very good at their craft.

Did you know that a scammer can get your credit card infomation, even if the card is in your purse or wallet? Be sure to have RFID cards to protect your credit card info.



PHISHING



Our friend, Mr. Webster. defines Phishing as: "The practice of tricking internet users (as through the use of deceptive email messages or websites) into revealing personal or confidential information which can then be used illicitly." A common way is to send you an email that looks strikingly similar to a real email. For example, the email address something might be "xxx@gmail.com." I have seen: Amazon@gmail.com.

Under **no** circumstances should you open this email. If it tells you that you are overdrawn and want permission to get into your bank account, **hang up and report them**.
